Comments: Varicella / Chicken pox is an acute viral disease caused by Varicella zoster virus (VZV) that belongs to the Herpes virus family. Reactivation of VZV usually manifests as Zoster (Shingles). The disease begins with fever, malaise and maculopapular rash that heals over a 3 week period. VZV IgM & IgG antibodies both usually appear within 5 days of the rash. IgM disappears in 2-4 weeks time whereas IgG antibody usually persists for indeterminate time. A positive IgG result indicates immunity or past exposure to VZV.
